

Under this club, any member of the Marian College community, be that administration, faculty, office personnel, maintenance personnel, or student, plus the members of your immediate family, would be covered for one year to receive free blood anywhere in the United States. In order to get this club established we need your help and support in donating blood to meet our necessary quota of 200 pints.

On Monday, January 20, 1975 from 8:30am-4:30pm in front of Marian Hall Auditorium, an information table will be set-up to provide further information about the club. Also, those who wish to donate a pint of blood should sign up at this time.

EDITORIAL

During vacation one of the activities that preoccupied my daily schedule was watching television. I know that doesn't seem like a very exciting way to spend a vacation, but there just isn't much else to do unless you're working somewhere. The only show that really interested and excited me during this particularly boring period was CBS's "60 Minutes" because their guest was G. Gordon Liddy.

Here was the man who conceived the break-in of the Democratic headquarters at Watergate. He was also one of the "plumber's" that were responsible for the break-in of Daniel Ellsberg's psychiatrist's office. He was the only one of the Watergate defendents who had not talked and was given the stiffest sentence by John Sirica. Now here he was on CBS talking to Mike Wallace. Since he is now out of jail on appeal he refused to discuss any matter of Watergate which dealt with his own case. Despite this drawback the interview proved interesting anyway. When asked how he felt about John Dean he replied, "in all fairness to the man he ranks

right up there with Judas Iscariot." Next Wallace asked him why he thought Dean testified against Nixon. To this he replied abruptly "to save his ass." However the most important thing I felt he had to say was his disagreement of Gordon Strauhan's advice to young people to stay away from Washington. He stated that if you are dissatisfied with the government the best way to change things is "to get off your duff and come to Washington, you're not going to change anything by sitting on the curb and bitch."
