Spring is steadily approachine and it's hard to realize that we are almost $3 / 4$ finished with this school year. At this time many students, especially freshmen reminisce how last year at this time they were still prospective students in process of makinc the decision of where to go to school. This past week I stopped back to reflect upon the question. "Why did I oo to harian Collece?"
