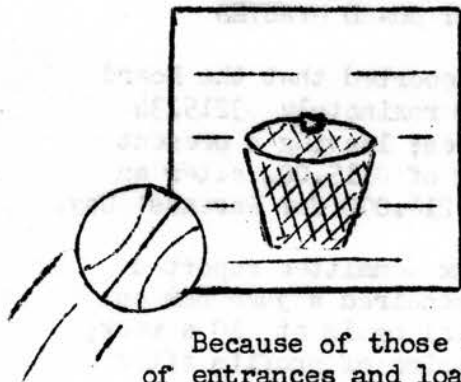

# THE CARBON

Because of those few students who persist in parking in front of entrances and loading platforms (not to mention on the grass or in the middle of the parking lots)—the Student Board is considering new parking restrictions!

Juniors and Seniors park in the Middle lot; Sopnomores park in the East lot; Freshmen and occasional drivers park in the West lot!

Each driver must register his car in the Registrar's Office and obtain a sticker for parking in his respective lot at the same time. A \$2.00 fine for parking in the wrong lot; \$5.00 fine for parking in the middle of the lot; \$5.00 fine for parking in no parking zones (these zones are listed in the handbook). Faculty members are requested to park in front of the Administration Building.

Any student incurring a fine will not be permitted to take the final exams until all bills and fines are paid. The money is to be used for the upkeep of the parking lots. Anything over and above will be placed in the Student Treasury.

All agree that something should be done about the parking problem. There will be those who feel that the steps contemplated by the Board are quite drastic. It has been suggested they could set up fines for parking in no parking zones and in the middle of the parking lots, and let the students, regardless of what class they are in, park in any of the three lots. Does anyone else have a suggestion?

A special bulletin will be issued to the student body within the next few days giving all the details of the new restrictions. The Student Board members will police the lots and assess these fines.

## STUDENT BOARD MINUTES

1. Treasurer reported that the Board will receive approximately \$3215.34 from student fees; leaving a present balance on hand of \$115.00, after an expenditure of 216.000 for Parents' Day.

2. The Juke Box Committee reported that they had acquired a juke box on a two weeks trial basis at \$10 a week, with equal division of profits after the \$10 was acquired.

3. Therese McCarthy moved that editorials concerning the student affairs should be encouraged in the Carbon, provided both sides of the issues are presented fairly. This motion was carried.

4. Maureen Feeney moved that Pat Henn be appointed co-editor of the Carbon. Motion carried.

5. Joann Hazelwood reported that a new bulletin board would soon be placed outside the Percolator, and that the Administration requests that signs be placed there and not scotch-taped in classrooms and corridors.

6. The Student Board approved the action of the Junior Class in sponsoring the first year book.

7. Herman Schrader moved that the Student Board should take some action, whereby, the property of Marian College in the lake and field regions be posted by the Sheriff of Marion Co. for the purpose of affording privacy for the faculty and student body of Marian College. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 6:00 p.m.
