## EDITORIAL

This Tuesday Faculty Council defeated proposal to give credit to Student Board office cers．Under this proposal the President could receive $i \frac{1}{2}$ hours of credit per semester and the other officers 8 hour of creidt per semester depending on the satisfactory performance of their duties and extra evaluative work 。

This action was especially unfortunate on the eve of Student Board nominations because it seemed to imply a lack of confidence in the value of student government．In fact，the imo plications is that even the Drum and Bugle Corps has more value，where ability at flag waving， marching，and the care and treatment of muddy tennis shoes is the only requisite for receive ing credit．I hardly see how this has more aca－ demic value that student government（Granted they spread the＂good＂name of the college no but since when is this an academic criteria fop credit）

In the past it has not been unusual for some faculty members to demean the value of student government，and then complain about the lack of competition fop offices．With this type of encouragement it is surprising that any people want to get involved in student governs ment．Yet some do，because they realize stu－ dent government is worthwhile，if tedious，work． Student government performs many services：bud w geting student funds，supervising publications and activities，originating proposals benefic cial to students and expanding student voice in college affairs．It also has advantages for the person who becomes involved in student goo vernment，which can be seen as having academic value，such as：working within governmental structures，organizing interests and working with other people，developing leadership qualia ties and public speaking，and many more 。

The action of Faculty Council was unfopo tunate and it did point out a certain irratione ality in granting credit．However，despite a lack of faculty support，student government will still perform its necessary function and will remain a valuable experience fop students．

Yesterday evening，March 28 ，1973，er＝ tain violations by 2 members of the administrao tio occurred．This was not an isolated incio dent．

A scheduled fire drill was not held at the assigned time．It is an understood rule that no fire drills are to be held after $12: 00$ mid night，especially after wing representatives and RA＇s had been notified that it was to take place at 11：00 pome Our complaints are as follows：

1．The fire marshall and the Clare Hall Roo were absent at the designated time of drill．
2．A poor example was set by the R。D。 in
front of Clare Hall women．The RonDo is on duty＂ 24 hours a day，seven days i week， $9 \frac{1}{2}$ months a years．＂
3．A scheduled fire drill，according to a state law，must be held at least once every two months and we have not had a scheduled drill since last fall
4．When the alarm was pulled at $12: 45$ ，it was discovered that the system was broken and had been for two months，thus jeapordizo ing every life in the hall．
5．Some wing reps were not notified of the conciliation and／or postponement of the drill The back doors of Clare Hall are locked at 7：00 pom。for security reasons．The R。D。＇s of both halls violated this policy last nite after the drill．It is a policy that several students have been severely reprimanded for violating due to security reasons．This policy must be obeyed by EVERYONE AT ALL TIMES：

We question why the alarm was not pulled at the designated time？Why the back door： were used after 7：00 poms And why the fire alarm system was not checked out sooner．

We believe that the above actions are serious violations of the Marian College secure． it policies and should be brought to th attention of students，faculty，and administrac tion。
