Since I had no idea what to expect from myself or them, I struggled with the risk and decision of whether to respond or let it pass as I have had to in the past. I am over-joyed to tell you I didn't let this wonderful opportunity go unexperienced.

Since I do not have enough room to share all my experiences with you that I have had with the few foreign students I've come to know, I'ld like to say, at least, that they are as warm, sensitive, appreciative, and as interesting as anyone I have ever known. I would also like to thank them for the growth they have allowed me to experience while I believe I was helping them

I want to share this with everyone because I know there are many foreign students who need and are hoping for the opportunity to share whatever experiences possible with an American student to help them learn to speak English better, and to learn about our culture and people themselves. Their desire to grow has already been expressed by coming here, but they still need others to help them to continue this process.

If you find yourself questioning the risk as I did, I want you to know the extreme value I feel it has been for me after having experienced the pleasue of their friendship. Please respond if you see this request in the CARBON
