In the October 24, 1977 issue of the Indianapolis NEWS, the Suburban News column, Suzanne Scoggins gave a very interesting synopsis of last Sunday's Speedway Town Board meeting. The main topic of controversy it seemed was an upcoming Ordinance 581. "The ordinance would require Speedway property owners renting their yards for parking space during May to obtain a variance from the Board of zoning appeals and purchase a \$10.00 license." According to Board vice-president Harry Eakin "the town expected \$1000. to \$1200. in fees would be collected and turned over to the Speedway Police Department to hire part-time people to enforce the ordinance."

The nearly 80 Speedway residents who attended the meeting vocalized many complaints. To some advocates of the American way of Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness, it was the principle of whether the government should tell the private owner what he can do with his own property. Other residents disagreed with the wording of the contract or discussed security or sanitation problems. Finally, "One person mentioned that enforcement would be nearly impossible with 400,000 people converging on the track on race day."

While there is truth to what they say, it seems that the good folk of Speedway have missed one very important incongruity to their impending Ordinance 581. 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HOMECOMING DANCE PRICE INCREASE

Student Board cut the Booster Club's budget by almost 40% the original amount that the Booster Club had budgeted for Homecoming was \$1,115.00 and this amount was cut to \$670.00. This rather severe financial setback forced the Booster Club into the unfortunate position of having to decide between either cancelling the Student Homecoming Dance due to a lack of adequate finances or increasing the price of Student Homecoming Dance tickets from the originally proposed \$12.00 per couple to \$15.00 per couple. Since the latter seemed the more reasonable course of action. Booster Club reluctantly decided on the ticket price increase. The purpose of this letter is to announce this price increase and to explain its necessity.
