The purpose of this Convention is first to develop some type of philosophy regarding the role of students within the College and secondly to study in depth the proposed Marian College Student Association Constitution. Specific delegates--administrators, Faculty, and students--have been chosen to participate in this Convention because of their special interests in Student Government but all interested individuals are encouraged to participate in this Convention.

The first session will begin at 1:00 p.m. in the SAC Auditorium. After an introduction the assembly will be divided into five groups to discuss major areas of the Constitution. Individuals may choose any one of the groups in which they would like to participate. Reports on the findings, recommendations, changes, etc. of each group will be given to the entire Convention and a voting will take place by the entire Convention. It is important to note here that although voting will take place and changes made in the proposed Constitution, final acceptance of particular recommendations will be made by the Student Board.

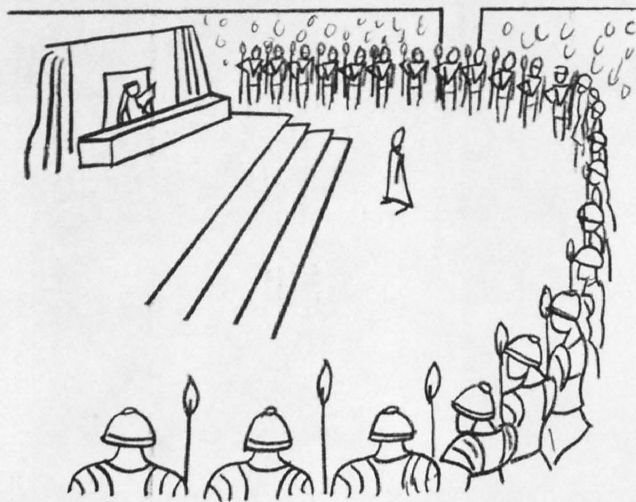

Yet the atrocity is war itself.

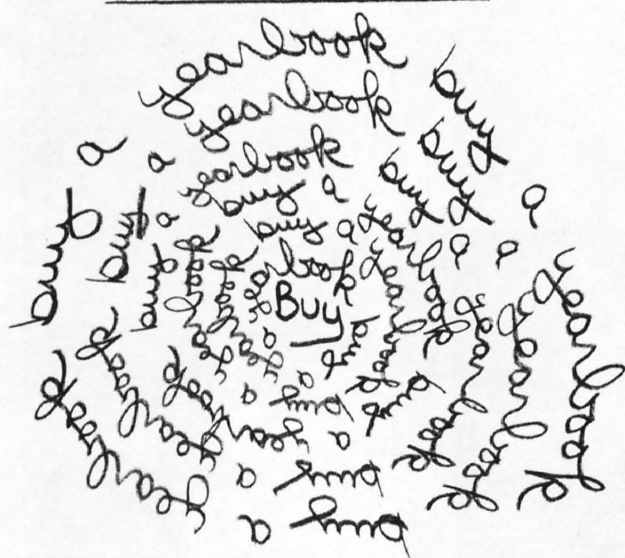
I shudder at killing villagers one by one,
