If you are still needing a Guaranteed Student Loan and have not filed papers for this academic year please do so as soon as possible. If you file after October I, I98I the following regulations are in effect:

- ---Students with family adjusted gross income of \$30,000 or less will automatically qualify for converse as at present.
- --Students with Family AGI income (including student income) of more than \$30,000 will qualify for Federal interest benefits only to the extent of "unmet need" as determined by the school. "Thmet need" is defined as estimated cost of attendance less expected family contribution plus any estimated student financial assistance reasonably available to the student.
- --Students with family adjusted gross income above \$30,000, who do not qualify according to the "need test" will still be able to obtain fully guaranteed student loans, but there will be no Federal interest subsidy and no Special Allowance for lenders. This provision is effective on loans which are disbursed on or after October I, 1981.
