Wilhoit led the Knights with 22 points. Kim Hatton followed with 12 points and 8 assists. Diane Ciciora had 10 rebounds and Liz Gilmore had 8.

Saturday February 2, was Parent's Day with the Knights hosting I.S.U.E. The Knights put on a good performance for the parents and had gotten their revenge. Earlier in the season the Knights were beaten by I.S.U.E., this time the Knights won the game in overtime by a score of 70 to 64. Julie Wilhoit had 22 points and Liz Gilmore had 13. Diane Ciciora had 12 rebounds and Kim Zeronik and Liz Gilmore both had 8.

Julie Wilhoit was nominated for N.A.I.A. player of the week. Kim Hatton also played an excellent week of basketball for the Knights.

The women traveled to Huntington Wednesday, February 6 and were defeated 88-69 by an aggressive Lady Forester team. Julie Wilhoit led the scoring with 24 points while Liz Gilmore had 15. Leading rebounders were Gilmore with 10 and Kim Zeronik with 9. Zeronik also contributed 5 assists for the Knights.
