The purpose of the Health Service is to provide quality, low cost, treatment of minor illness and injury for Marian College students, faculty and staff. Because the resources of Health Service are limited, continued and primary care for serious medical problems is provided on a referral basis.

The Health Clinic is open from 11:30 AM-2:30 PM Monday through Friday (except vacations). The nurse cares for minor ailments, dispenses non-prescription medication and refers patients for further care. A doctor is available on a fee-for-service basis three days per week on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Although the FIORETTI is not published until the spring semester, the date for submission of entries has been set as October 24—December 16. The categories are as follows: 1) Photography-all photographs must be no larger than 5" x 7", 2) Drawing-maximum size for drawings is 7" in width x 8½" in height, or 14" in width by 8½" in Height, and the media for drawings is limited to ink, felt tip pen, or dark (soft lead) pencil. 3) Poetry, 4) Short Story, 5) Drama, 6) Personal Essay.

All creative writing entries must be typed (double-spaced) and all entries, including photographs and drawings must be titled. Each entry must be accompanied by a sheet containing the following information: submitter's name and phone number, title of the entry, and in the case of writing entries, the category. Also, if the submittee wishes to have his entry returned, this should be clearly specified. Unless this is done, entries will not be returned. Entries may be submitted to the Information Office in Marian Hall during the dates mentioned above. There will be prizes awarded for the best entry in each category.
