HEALTH CLINIC HOURS AND SERVICES-----

A completed Marian College Health Record form is required of all students for treatment in the Health Clinic. Health Record forms are available at the Student Services Office, Ist floor, Marian Hall.

The Health Clinic is located on the ground floor, west wing of Clare Hall. The services of a registered nurse are available without cost to all students, faculty, and staff, Monday through Friday (except vacations) at the time indicated below. The nurse cares for minor ailments, dispenses non-prescription medication and refers students for further care.

Students may use any physician of their choice. In the event a student does not have a physician, the student may consult with the College Physician. His services are available on a "fee for service" basis, usually at a reduced rate. His office and telephone number are:

If an emergency occurs during clinic hours, call the College Nurse, Ext. 552. The nurse will assume responsibility for notifying a physician, if necessary.

If an emergency occurs during the normal work day (8:00 AM - 4:30 PM), but during non-clinic

hours, call the Student Services Office, Ext. 250.

If a medical emergency occurs beyond normal work hours and before I2:00 midnight contact the Marian College Switchboard Operator (Dial "0" from on campus) describe the nature of problem and the type of assistance you need.

Don't forget that discount tickets to any General Theater cinema can be purchased from members of the Student Board. The tickets cost \$2.50 each, and you may purchase any number for the use of Marian students.
