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When I evaluate the responses to the vey that we took, I am looking for an ACCEP\* TANCE PERCENTAGE. This is determined by adding the Very Good, Good, and Fair and dividing this-number by the total responses. Company wide the general range for such percentages is:

Again thank you very much for this which is my best survey ever. I will continue to work to improve our food service. As far as the two problem areas I have marked above, I am going to effect the following action.


Cleanliness of dishs and silverware: Comments on the survey and made to me by the people filling out the survey indicated that this was mainly a problem of the white film left of the silver. Most people felt that this was soap film. It isn't, it is a calcium deposit left by hard water. We have a water Softner and are going to try to keen it running smoothly to keep soft water. The other major problem is with peanut butter on spoons and knives. That problem will be solved with the dish washers and they will be on the closer watch for it.

Temperture of food: We will work with the line servers on this. It will be neces-sarv to keep predishing to a minimum. Predished foods will only be up during periods when a considerable number of people are coming through. If that doesn't solve the problem we will have to go to dishing to order. It will slow down the line but at areas before they get too big to handle.least your food will be warm.

Again I want to thank you for this vote of confidence for this semester. I will do my best to continue to keep you happy for and thank you very much one and all.
