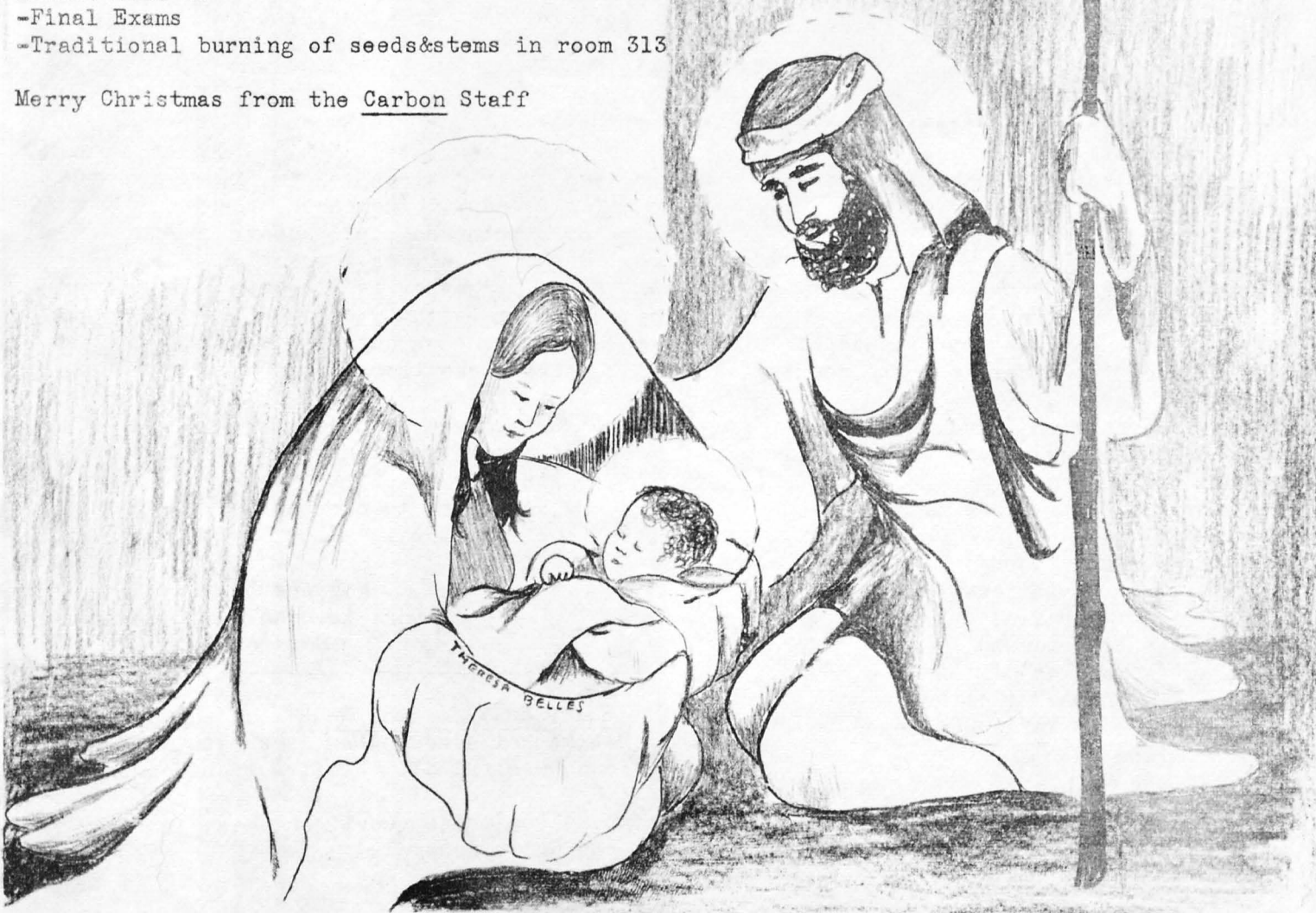

THE FALL SEMESTER STUDENT ATTITUDE SURVEY

The fall semester student attitude survey was administered on November 15. I would like to take this opportunity to tell you about the results and to give you some background about the survey itself.

The question can (and Has) be asked, "why bother with a survey." Well the reason's for a survey include:

- 1) it gives a chance to improve communications between the students (thats you) and the food service (I think thats me).
- 2) to give me some statistical information about student concerns in our area.
- 3) to provide for me a warning system, that will point out small problem areas before they get too big to handle.

The first Saga Student Attitude Survey was taken at a College in 1955. Since that time it has developed into a formal survey that is taken at every Saga Educational Division account, every semester. Other surveys that have branched out from this are the Administrator Attitude Survey and the Snack Bar Survey.

When I evaluate the responses to the survey that we took, I am looking for an ACCEPTANCE PERCENTAGE. This is determined by adding the Very Good, Good, and Fair and dividing this-number by the total responses. Company wide the general range for such percentages is:

My boss says that I must maintain an 85% acceptance percentage. This is in each area of the survey. If I fall below this rating I must provide an action plan on how to deal with the problem in order to bring it up to standards to meet your satisfaction.

Our specific ratings this semester were:

Variety of food98.4%
Cleanliness of dishes and silver ,,,85.7%
(problem area)

Cleanliness of tables.....100% (a gold star for the girls)

Quality of food.....99.2%

Tempature of food....90.5% (score doesn't indicate a problem but its there)

Freshness of food96%

Attractiveness of food....100% (a gold star for the kitchen)

Quality of Food.....96.8%

Flavor of food.....96.8%

Quality of service....98.4%

Overall food service...100% (Thank You)

Again thank you very much for this which is my best survey ever. I will continue to work to improve our food service. As far as the two problem areas I have marked above, I am going to effect the following action.

Cleanliness of dishes and silverware: Comments on the survey and made to me by the people filling out the survey indicated that this was mainly a problem of the white film left of the silver. Most people felt that this was soap film. It isn't, it is a calcium deposit left by hard water. We have a water Softner and are going to try to keep it running smoothly to keep soft water. The other major problem is with peanut butter on spoons and knives. That problem will be solved with the dish washers and they will be on the closer watch for it.

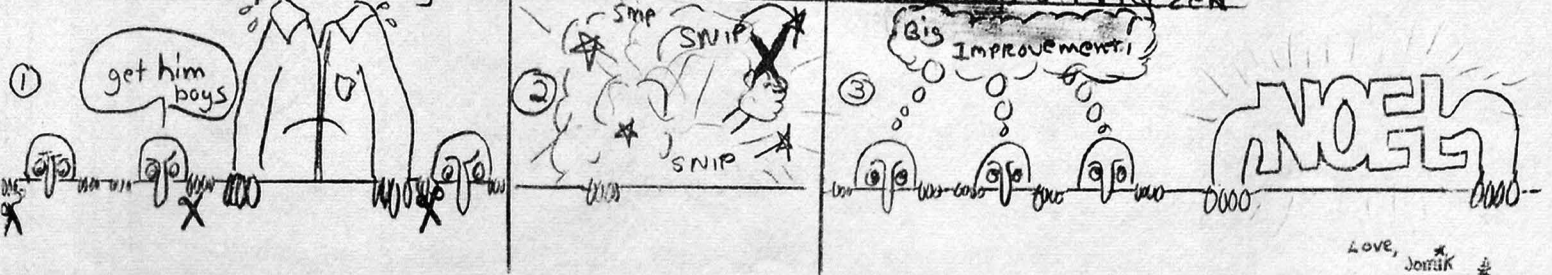
Temperture of food: We will work with the line servers on this. It will be necessary to keep predishing to a minimum. Pre-dished foods will only be up during periods when a considerable number of people are coming through. If that doesn't solve the problem we will have to go to dishing to order. It will slow down the line but at least your food will be warm.

Again I want to thank you for this vote of confidence for this semester. I will do my best to continue to keep you happy for what remains of this semester and next. Good luck with your finals, have a nice Christmas and thank you very much one and all.

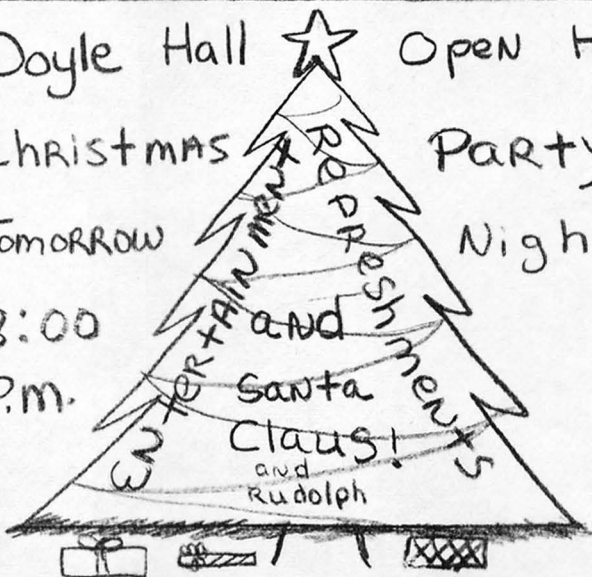
