The fall semester student attitude survey was administered on November 15. I would like to take this opportunity to tell you about the results and to give you some background about the survey itself。

The question can (and Has) be asked, "why bother with a survey." Well the reason's for a survey incluce:

1) it gives a chance to improte communications between the students (thats you) and the food service (I think thats me).
2) to give me some statictical inm formation about student concerns in out area.
3) to provide for me a warning system, that will point out small problem areas before they get too big to handle
The first Saga Student Attitude Survey was taken at a College in 1955. Since that time it has developed into a formal survey that is taken at every Sag Educational Division account every semester. Other surveys that have branched out from this are the Administrator Attitude Sur vey and the Snack Ear Survey.

When I eveluate the resnonses to the sirvey that we took, I am looking for an ACCEP* TANCE PERCENTAGE. This is determined by ading the Very Good, Good, and Fair and dividing this-number by the total responses. Company wide the general renge for such percentages is:

| $85-93 \%$ | Average |
| below - $85 \%$ | Below Average |

My boss says that I must maintain an $85 \%$ acceptance percentage. This is in each area of the survey. If I fall below this rating I must provide an action plan on how to deal with the problem in order to bring it up to standards to meet your satisfaction.

Quality of service. ... $98.4 \%$
Overall food service... $100 \%$ (Thank You)
Again thank you very much for this which is my best survey ever. I will continue to work to improve our food service. As far as the two problem areas I have marked above, I am gaing to offect the following action.

Cleanliness of dishs and silverware: Comments on the survey and made to me by the people filling out the survey indicated that this was mainly a problem of the white film left of the silver. Most peonle felt that this was soap film. It isn't, it is a calcium deposit left by hard water. We have a water softner and are going to try to kean it running smoothly to keep soft water. The other major problem is with neanut butter on spoons and knives. That problem will ha solved with the dish washers and they will be on the closer watch for it.

Temnerture of food: We will work with the line servers on this. It will he necessary to keen predishing to a minimum. Pre dished foods will only bo up during neriods when a considerable number of people are coming through. If that doesn't solve the problem we will have to go to dishing to order. It will slow down the line but at . least your food will be warmo

Again I want to thank you for this voto of confidence for this semester. I will do my best to continke to keep you hapoy for what remains of this semester and nexto Good luck with youf finals, have a nice Christmas and thank you very much one and all.
