STUDENT BOARD REPORTS

There was a meeting of the Student Board on Wednesday evening. A treasury balance of \$4,351.45 was reported.

In reports from the dorms, it was reported that the Doyle Hall Council is buying basketball mets and goals. The first Clare Hall meeting was held with new officers, and hours, dues, lounge, and inter-visitation was discussed. The class representatives to the Board for next year are:

Seniors: Laura Jo Biltz and Evelyn Smith Juniors: Karla Bartling and Rita Benson Sophomores: Suzy Knueven and LindaMcSparin The Social Council reported that the calendar was being worked on. The senior class debt to the Student Board was discussed, along with the possibility of taking the money out of next year's allocation.

The vice-president reported that the Constitution Revision Committee will meet Friday, May 15, at noon (that's today). It was also reported that Dick Gregory will speak at Earlham today, at the same time. It is a free appearance.

The president mentioned the meeting with Trustees Pitts and Dillon. The referendum comcerning the N.S.A. Coordinator post was discussed with Mrs. Kolb, and the question is to be very general. The facts concerning the issue will be presented, and a question, to the effect -- Does N.S.A. Coordinator constitute an officer of the Board? will be asked The referendum is scheduled for Wednesday.

President Herbe also remarked on the subject of Board advisor and the discussion of this issue with Dr. Guzzetta. Dr. Guzzetta mentioned that there is a trend across the country to have the advisor to the Student Board be a member of Student Services.

Mimi Meyer was approved as yearbook editor Carbon editors Bill Brodnax, Elaine Ransom, and Dave Soots were also confirmed.

Nominations to the Academic Affairs Committee and the Student Services Committee were considered, with no confirmations. Herb Finke and Mike Hohl were appointed to the Program Committee.

Gien Tebbe moved that the Board allocate \$900. to the <u>Phoenix</u> to purchase an IBM Composer. This motion was tabled for further consideration.

Stacy Smith moved that the Student Board allocate \$250. for the Marian Eleven, who are now free on \$460. bond total. This bond was incurred as a result of charges leveled against these students in a demonstration supporting Board actions during the Pedtke situation. The motion is to be considered further next week.

Stacy Smith also mentioned the possibility of the Board having a lawyer on retainer. The Boardwas asked to consider this.
