It is hoped that the former baker will return next fall. 2) The current menus served on campus are reviewed by several college personnel. 3) The managers are in the dining room at meal time and complaints should be reported to them when they occur. 4) At certain times menus are changed for everyone. 5) In a 21 day cycle they try not to serve any item more than twice. He will investigate the suggestion of reallocating money

spent on decorations for special events to direct food costs. - Dr. Lord is the College's physician.
