HOW IMPORTANT IS "NF"?

East Monday at the Student Board meeting NF was refused a \$10 allotment for an increase in dues. During the discussion the question arose, "How has the NF benefited the student body?"

Before answering this question it would be wise to review the purpose of NF.

The name, National Federation of Catholic College Students, in itself implies the nature of the organization. It is a means of providing contact with other Catholic college students for the purpose of exchanging ideas, reporting events of worth on the various campuses, and stating as a group their opinions on various controversial topics.

Now that you are familiar with the purpose, has the NF actually been detrimental to the student body? . . . No. . . .

"Has it benefited the student body?" . . . Yes.

The Press Commission of NF has sponsored an assembly of five leading Catholic journalists for the benefit of our students and high school students. Two issues of the regional newsletter, The Scoop, have been printed and distributed to our campus and the five other colleges in the Fort Wayne region. CURA, an organization designed to help foreign students attend our colleges, has sponsored fund raising activities.

Is it not important for Marian to have contact with other colleges in this region? If not, through NF, how? "No man is an island." Neither should a college be such.
