EDITORIAL

On April 29, voting will be held on the proposed Day Representative amendment to the Student Board Constitution. So far, the main point for justification or criticism of a Day Representative is that it merely gives a vote to the day students in Board proceedings. But a careful analysis of the effects of a Day Representative will show that there is more than a negative aspect to the issue.

Consider the positive contribution that the presence of a Day Representative will initiate:

1. It will provide a means to unite and centralize day student activity in a way that supercedes the diffuse representation of day students through the various classes and clubs.
2. It will implement action in those areas of the total Marian make-up that specifically and primarily affect day students.
3. It will officially organize the majority element of Marian's enrollment into a functioning unit.

Finally, the Day Representative will be a vital factor in completing the integration of all student interest and opinion, with the long-range effect of establishing better inter-organizational relationships.
