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MASS CELEBRATES 25th YEAR

Yesterday in Chapel, Mass was celebrated commemorating Marian's 25th Anniversary of higher education. Monsignor Reine in his sermon reviewed the past 25 years, and included a look to the future.

The President pointed out that actually, March 25, 1937, was the day on which the Sisters of St. Francis were granted a charter by the State of Indiana to teach at the college level. Classes began the following September with a total enrollment of 100 pupils. Among those teaching at the founding were Msgr. Doyle, Sister Gertrude Marie, and Sister Gonsalva. Many faculty members have been here nearly as long, holding classes in Madonna Hall.

Interesting facts and statistics quoted by Msgr. Reine were:

1087 students have graduated from Marian in the 25 years.

In 1948--49, Clare Hall and the Gym were constructed.

In 1953--54, the Administration Bldg and Auditorium were built.

In 1954, Marian turned co-ed

In 1956, we were accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges

We've had 3 presidents, the two former being Mother Mary Clarissa, and Sister Mary Kevin. Msgr. became president in September, 1954.

The present rectory was originally used as a garage, then a cafeteria, then a kindergarden for student teachers. Now it is again part garage.

Looking to the future, Monsignor pointed out that one need not be a prophet to see that three buildings will be necessary if Marian continues to expand as it has--a Men's Dorm, a Library, and a Student Union Bldg. Provisions will then be made for a graduate school.

By looking at the past, we see that Marian is on the march, but we must try not to be too impatient.

"The purpose of the Mass was to give thanks for the past, to offer prayers for those who have gone before, to ask for guidance for the future, and to rededicate ourselves. We hope that, on the occasion of our Golden Jubilee, the results will be just as amazing."
