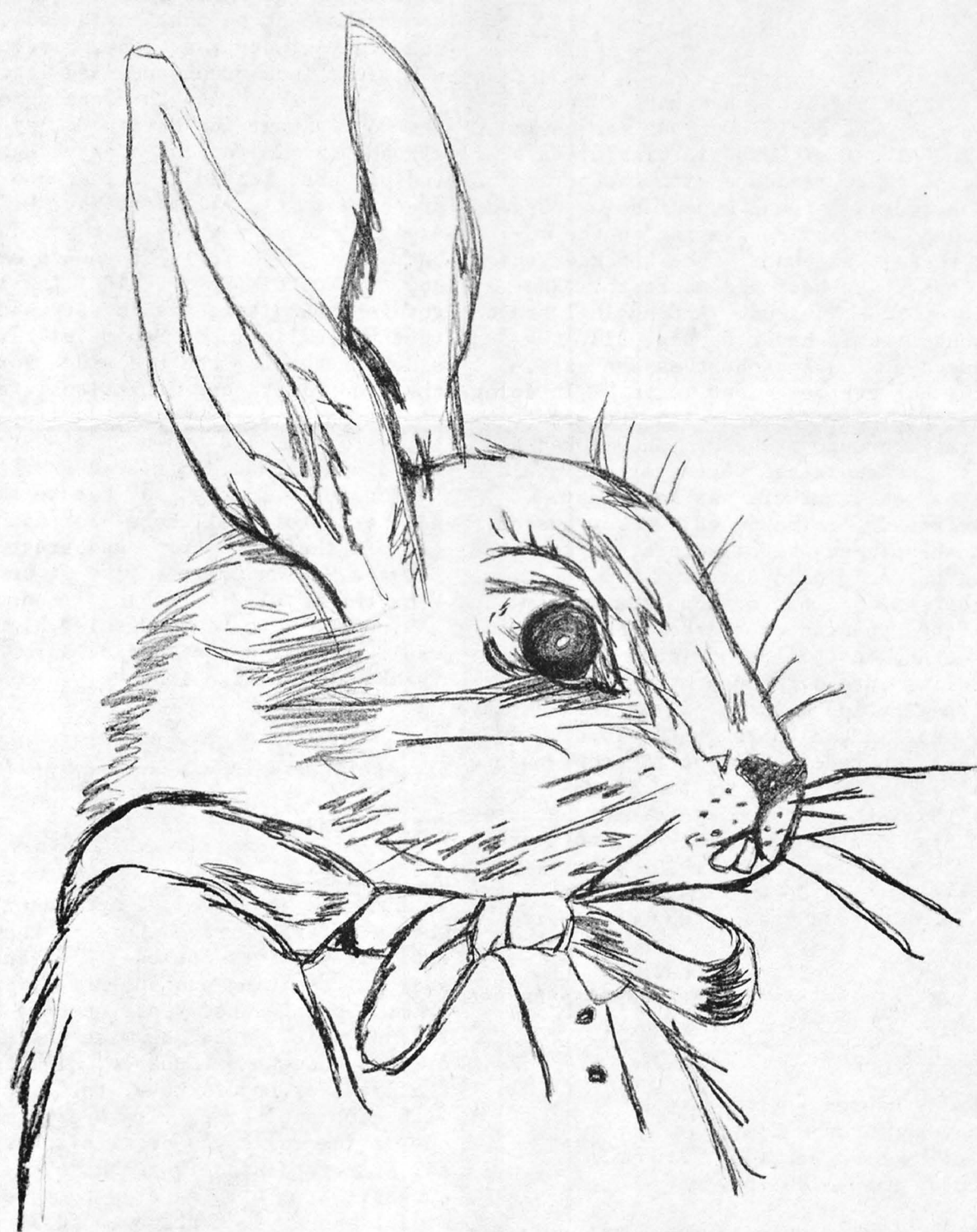

We are sorry if our incontinuity disturbs you, but we have been rather pleased. Just recently, we have been receiving tremendous amounts of material from students and faculty commenting on campus issues. The Carbon has become a medium for voicing opinions, and this is how it should be. These are student contributions. The Carbon is a vehicle for those contributions. It is not a student newspaper, contrary to your belief. The press is free, or so guarantees the Bill of Rights.

The Carbon's main function is informative. Each issue contains a calendar of events, announcements of meetings, business affairs and employment, sports news, and letters presenting the moods on campus. We frequently print a poem or a quote that is chosen for its profundity as well as its artistic value. We like to think of the Carbon as interesting as well as entertaining. But that's our opinion.

We are saddened to hear that the main interest in the Carbon is the "Applauds and Hisses". We realize that this, so far, has also been used as a platform for airing opinions. However, only 10% of the comments made are of social interest or even understanding. Most material is "esoteric" (a word offered by our advisor. To be informative, it translates into "intended for or understood by only a small group."). Therefore, "Applauds and Hisses" are not given priority. If we feel we have a piece that will inform or enlighten the student body, we will opt for education.

Undoubtedly, "Applauds and Hisses" has its entertainment value for those who "contribute". It is seeing one's expression of praise and/or anger in print that adds the interest.
