OPEN LETTER TO THE STUDENT BODY:

Isn't college life supposed to be stimulating and thoughtprovoking? Shouldn't students be given an opportunity to put their theories into practice while they are yet in college? Yes, says the Student Board. Yes, said the huge turnout at the Student Board meeting.

What is Marian's problem then? The students are quick to place the blame on the faculty and administration who baby us, who won't let us assume our responsibilities. It is the organized groups and clubs who won't meet the real vital issues on campus--who won't respond to current needs and situations--who won't try to innovate. It is the city who has isolated the college by ignoring it. All of this seemed so true! College is supposed to be exciting, stimulating--not a glorified high school. We are adults, cried the students!

For years these same criticisms have issued from the student body. Now it is time for the truth to be known. The students need not look any further than their own apathy as the cause for any problems which exist on campus.

Last Monday night the Education Committee of Action sponsored a coffee hour inviting a Republican nominee for the Ind. House and a Democratic nominee for prosecutor. Both local and national issues were discussed at this timely meeting. (It was held the night before the elections.) There was not one activity planned that was related to the upcoming elections. A sampling of the students was taken and an overwhelming majority was in support of having a political coffee hour before the elections.

The student body had an opportunity to take an active part in a program of current and vital issues but the students didn't take advantage of this. It must be labeled "student apathy".

Surely, we must place part of the blame with the Student Board. Where was the support of the Student Board--the champion of the students? fighting for student responsibility? The Student Board urges student initiative but in this instance when a club tried to follow up on their ideas the Student Board, instead of supporting it, competed with it.

Maybe Marian students just like to talk. They are willing to support an idea as long as they don't personally get involved.

Dare you, the student body, be Christian, a person living, working and participating in the world in conjunction with your fellow man? Dare you take the initiative and attempt to function to your fullest social and intellectual capacity? How many Marian students dare answer these questions in the affirmative? Too many students are apathetic to the demands of actively participating in the small community of this college. If you can't function in this minute portion of a much larger, much more viciously demanding society--dare you leave these sheltered halls and live in the world?

Following the current national trend the Board went conservative this week.
