The parking committee recommended that no parking signs be placed around the library because of traffic congestion. It was decided to appropriate funds to purchase signs to enforce the present traffic regulations.

The group voted to purchase 5 doz. new candleholders for use at social functions. Since twenty candleholders are missing from the present set, the group responsible for the loss will be charged for that part of the purchase.

It was moved and seconded to have the executive committee of the board act as a committee for approving club constitutions for the remainder of the school year. It was further decided that this committee should study the student association constitution and determine the amendments necessary to have a set policy on the recognition of clubs.

It was also left to this committee to study the need for amendments about the financial policy of the organization.

A committee was formed to compile a booklet or handbook including all the existing policies and regulations of the college regarding school activities. This would especially be useful to class and club officers, social activities chairman and other student leaders.
