## EDITORIAL

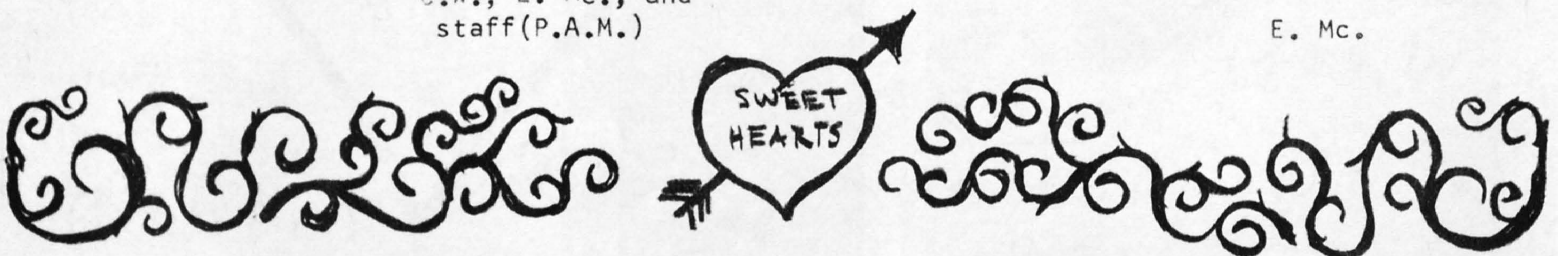

## From the Masses:

The Guest Hours Policy was passed by Faculty Council on Tuesday, February 8, with a 16-4-2 vote. On February 9 the policy was presented to the Board of Trustees at their regularly scheduled meeting. However, at this time no action was taken. The Guest Hours Policy was instead referred to a newly formed committee on Student Affairs. The committee will be researching and meeting with representative groups of the college to discuss and research the policy. At the April Board of Trustees, the Student Affairs Committee will present their evaluation and recommendation to the Board for action to be taken.

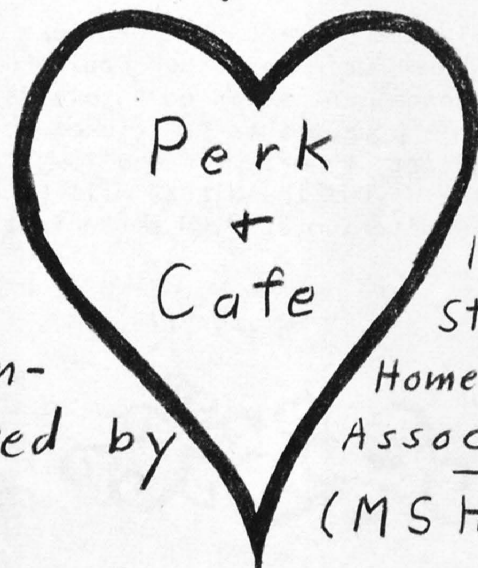
Work on this policy began in September of 1971. It has been discussed in full by each of the following established administrative bodies: both dorm councils, Student Board, Student Services Committee, and Faculty Council. The policy itself has gained wide - spread support within the college community. Our opinion is that after research, evaluation, and discussion by all the above mentioned groups, there is no need for further delay in the implementation of the policy. The realization that the Board of Trustees should seriously consider such a policy change is clearly understood. However, to require further intensive research is to deny the competency of the preceding groups. Our feeling is that the policy should go into affect no later than April 1st. This would allow sufficient time for the Trustees to reach a decision. From the administration point of view it would also be advantageous by permitting evaluation and necessary revisions before the opening of the 1972 academic year.

Again we would like to express our strong dissatisfaction with the delay of implementation.

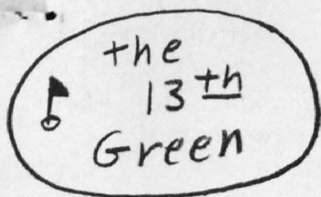

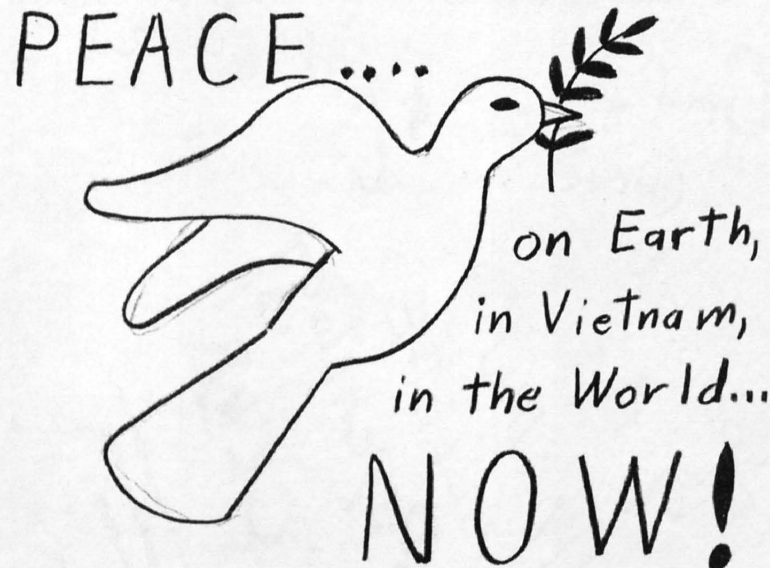

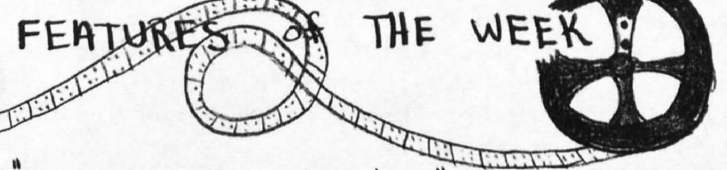
