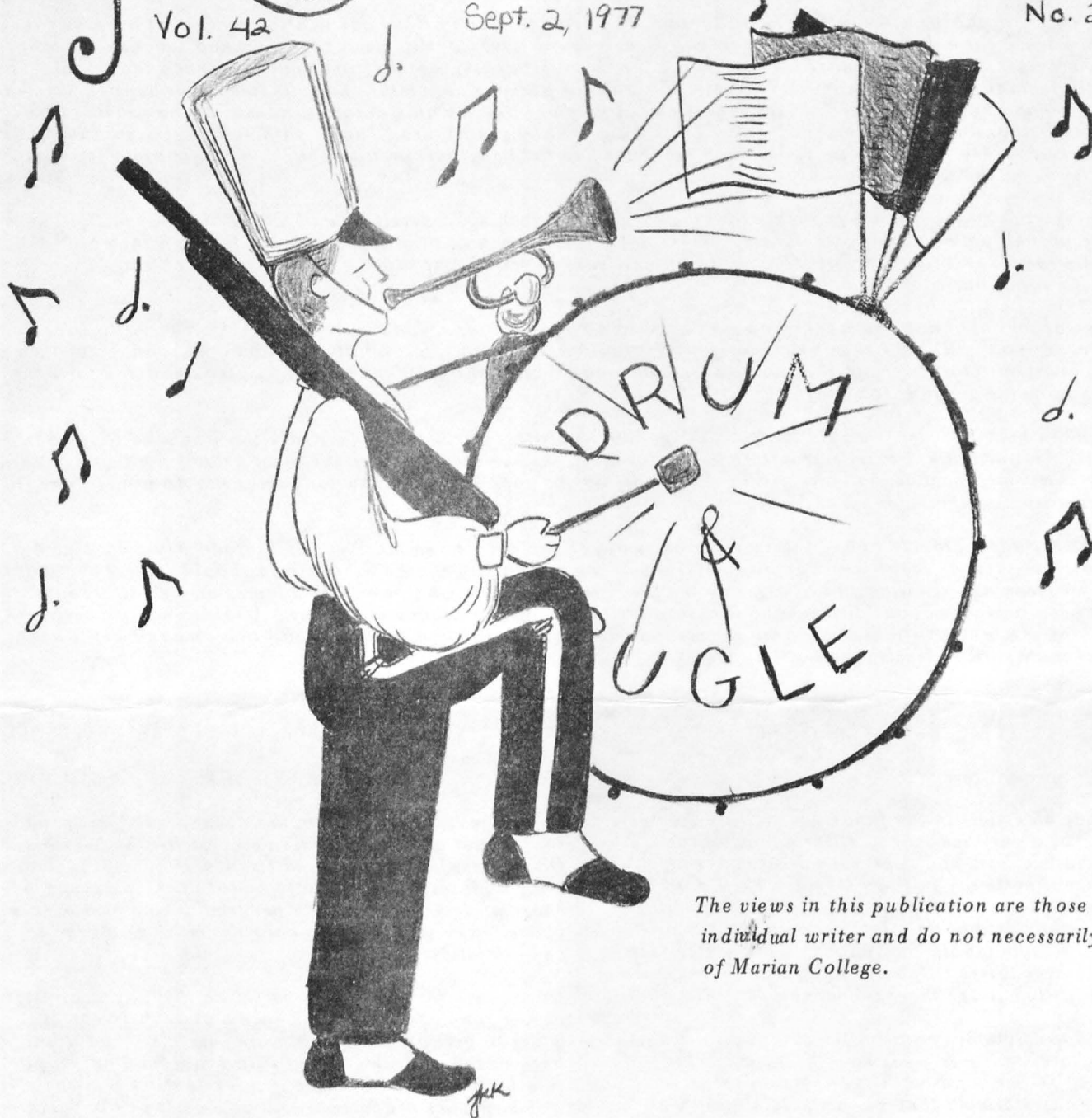

## TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Due to a misplacement of administrative priorities, this year's residents of Clare and Doyle Halls have found that the illustrious dorm life depicted in the Marian College catalogue is non-existent. In the zealous efforts of our Administration to raise revenues by renting out the dorms to summer "guests" (i.e. band camps) it has wreaked havoc upon the living conditions of its academic students.

While the school year maintenance is adequate on a day-to-day basis, summer abuse of the buildings has resulted in an excess of maintenance problems.

Upon entering the dorm, the August to May residents pay a damage deposit with the stipulation that when they leave their rooms will be neat, clean and in good repair. Upon doing so, students will get their deposit money back; if not, the students are fined. Our summer "guests" are not, however, afforded the same "courtesy" of having a built-in incentive to leave the rooms in the clean condition they found them. The result is the filth with which this year's resident students had to face upon their arrival.

In a recent series of photographs in the NEWS (presently posted in Marian Hall) one caption reads that normally it takes about a week for a dorm student to settle in. Sure it does! Five days to clean the room and two days to move in your belongings! Among the delights are cleaning the floor with rusty water (from your sink!) and industrial strength disinfectant. Next you may have to strip the walls of putty, glue, picture hangers (whatever happened to the neat nail hole?) and bugs. In Clare Hall, the real trick is to do all your cleaning before sundown as the lighting is so dim. On the first and second floors, notice the black base of the light fixture. That is filth and bugs accumulated over the semesters! On the third floor, desk and medicine cabinet lights just aren't enough to compensate for that "map rail light" on the wall.

As a solution we advocate one of the following courses of action. Either summer "guests" should pay a damage deposit to motivate them to leave their room in good repair or Marian College Administration should reserve the month of August for cleaning, repairing and fumigating the premises. Students who pay \$600 a semester for half a room should not have to worry about disinfecting it before settling into their academic routine. AND though we realize that improving the present situation in both dorms is a major undertaking in both cost and time, we suggest it be done before the Board of Health makes the suggestion.
