## SPORT SHORTS

### MARIAN COLLEGE BASKETBALL 1979

The Marian Knights ended a most successful season on a most disappointing note last Saturday night when they were defeated by the Grace Lancers 65-63 in overtime. They then suffered their most crushing loss of the year on Monday when they had been beaten out of the play-offs, by Bethel, by .07 of a point, to a team that they beat twice during the regular season. Thus, the Knights ended their season with a record of 13-12 and winners in five of their last seven games, with both losses by two points in the last four seconds.

In Saturday night's game the Knights were led by Jim Brothers with 18 points and 10 rebounds and Chad Miller with 17 pts. and nine rebounds. The Knights had a chance to win the game at the end of regulation time but Phil Savari's 20 foot shot rattled out of the rim. The Knights led only once in the overtime, 61-59 on a Jim Brothers field goal. However, the Lancers won it on two free throws with four seconds left and the Knights saw their third, and most successful, season under Head Coach John Grimes end. John Brinkley's desperation half-court shot hit the backboard, to the right of the basket, as the buzzer sounded.

The Knights, after ending Marian's first winning season in five years, now look ahead most anxiously to November 10 when they open up the 1979-80 season at St. Francis. They are looking to recapture that play off berth in 1980 that was "robbed" of them this year. With no senior members on the club and the bitter memory of not making the play-offs imbedded in all those returning, you can bet that a Marian play-off spot is less than 365 days away!!

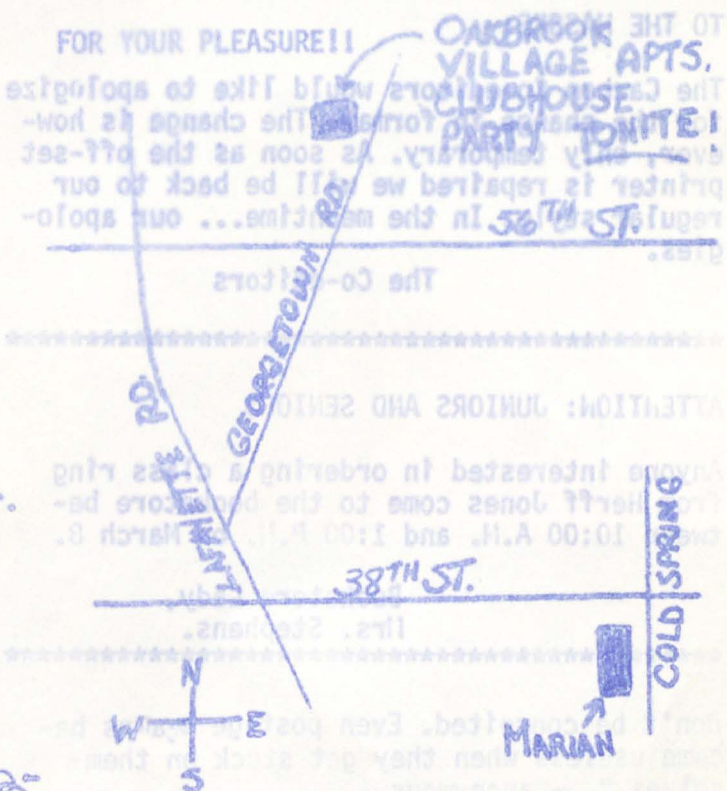

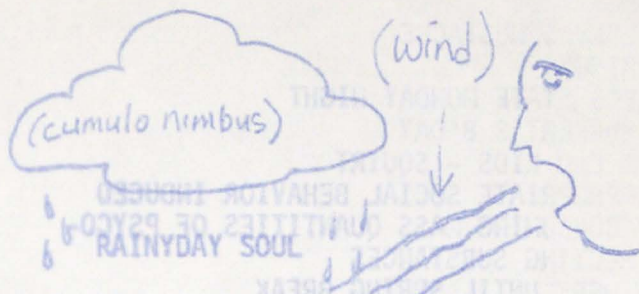
