The increase to which we are inferring is the amazing improvement in the scores that our senior majors received this year on the comprehensive psychology examination that they are required to pass as part of our departmental graduation requirements. Our majors have traditionally done very well on this test (usually averaging near the 60th percentile). This year, however, their average increased dramatically to above the 83rd percentile. This is truly an impressive statistic because this test is nationally standardized, which means that our majors were being compared to all other senior psychology majors at other colleges and universities.
