"Freeze, gun" was not far behind in his car and proceeded after him. The Unfortunate one slipped while running and "Freeze, Gua" had his naked victim trapped.



E Defer unt went to see the Dean. When he arrived, in the room sat "Frieze, Gun", we the Deal. The Dean asked "Freeze, Gun" if this was the person he apprehended for strack! "Freeze Gun" said no. Defendant told them goodbye and left thinking it was all over.

Two days later, Defendant was notified to go back and see the Dean. Whe he arrise the second time, the room was occupied with "Freeze Gun", his wife, and the Dean. A sectime, the Dean asked "Freeze Gun" if this was the person he apprehended for streakin. The time "Freeze Gun" said yes, it is. Defendant told them both "Bullshit! I was in my room to sleep whenever this happened." Defendant has a private room, therefore, no roomate this claim. Next he went to trial.

The fidicial Panel (in case you didn't know) is the adjudicating body on this carbus. It is composed of two faculty, two administrators and three students. Last ebruary, it econo effective, after much debate in College Council. When I served on the banel last year, and for the first case this year (I'm no longer on it), I considered it to be just, fair, and "the greatest thing since sliced bread" on the carbus. At least I did until now.

The first time Defendant went to the Judicial Pane' hearing, it was postboned for one week because the Dean felt a need for further investigation (they already hed over a week to investigate) and also to try and implicate more people (does that sound virdicting?) So a mark later, Defendant came back to have his case heard (I thought we were entitled to a hearing without too much delay).

At the hearing "Freeze Gun" and his wife (she was in the car with him don't g t e reat chase) testified that Defendent was the streaker they saw. Defendent then took the stark. His defense was very simple. It don't me and I don't have any alibit or witnesses. The Parel questioned "Freeze Gun" about the incident and the alib of paper that" Inforturate" printed his name and room number on. The piece of paper was produced and defendant's printing was matched against it. The Panel is not handwriting experts, but the difference between the two was obvious. The panel recessed and 45 minutes later, returned with a verdict of guilty. They recessed again and 25 minutes later returned with a strict sanction. There are three issues that this case involves which seem very serious to me. The first

There are three issues that this case involves which seem very serious to me. The first is the Defendant's innocence. I have for fact that he is innocent and in reality the "Unfortunate" victim of circumstance. I will not concern myself with his case here, because it's teing appealed and I know that at Conduct Appeals, he will find justice.

The second issue is the dangerous precedent set by the Judicial Fanal's verdict of guilt. The Panel found the Befendant guilty on the basis of two peoples positive identification of him, completely rejecting the handwriting as evidence. The Panel questioned "Freeze Gun" as to why he changed his mind about Defendant being the streaker between the first two meetings in the Dean's office. "Freeze Gun" answered, "I wanted to be sure". At best, that is a shire answer, yet the panel accepted it. The case womes down to one point, that is, the word of a student against the word of a security cop. The banel feels that it would undermind the ability of the Campus Security, R.A.'s, and R.D.'s if they accepted a student's word over theirs. This may be trufin some cases, but not in all. What this means, is that in our case that involves a student's word against an R.A.'s, the student is going to lose, despite any evidence that might be presented to cast a doubt on the credibility of the R.A. or campus security's testimony. The student's word on this campus means absolutely nothing, and goddenmit, that's NOT justice. Now I ask you; for whomdoes this school exist?

The third issue that this case involves is much larger in score than the first two. I, became interested as to what the official violation brought against the Deredort as, since I never recelled reading anything in the Student Handbook about streaking. The violation was Section 5.01-C. Violation of Civil, State, or Federal Statutes; namely violation of Chantre B, section 10-904. Indecent exposure of person, lewd conduct, obscene literature, art and nutlin performances of the Indianapolis Municipal Code. EDITCRIAL Con't

Section 5.01-C says that we, as students, are citizens of not only the college, but the city, county, state and nation as well. Therefore, we are subject to the laws of Civil, State, and Federal Statutes. Defendant was charged with a violation of the Indianapolis Municipal Code; Chapter 9, Section 10-904. Upon looking through the handboob, I came across Section 8, which deals with State Laws pertaining to Students Rights and Responsibilities. Section 8 deals with "Certain section of Burns, Indiana Statutes that are pertinent to the rights and responsibilities of Marian College Students". The only Indiana Statues mentioned in Section 8 are 8.01; Alcohol, and 8.02; Distribution, Sale, Possession or use of Drugs. How, you might ask yourself, could Defendant be brought up on a charge that is not listed as being pertinent to the rights and responsibilities of M C students in Section 8. The answer is easy. You see, there's a catch, and the catch is, Section 5.01+C; one of the many Catch-22's of Marian. Another one is the housing contracts that we all have to sign. No matter what, we (students) lose.

Colleges are institutions and Marian is no different. Marian is supposed to be different from other institutions, in that, it is small, and caters itself to the individual. While much larger colleges and universities are so vast that they become entangled within their own bure ucracy and the value placed on the student, is lost. In other words, the institutions exists for the institution, whereas Marian, supposedly, for the student. Again I ask vou, for whom does this school exist? Marian is no better than the large schools, because this school exists for the institution, not the students. So it is no wonder to me that students look at this school with contempt, not respect.
