MIXED LOUNGE CLOSING DRAWS COMMENT:

Frequently, the lounge has been littered with cups and bottles, lunch sacks and trash of every imaginable description. Up till this time the Board has contented itself with repeated warnings, which have done little, if any, good. Much of the above can be disregarded as lack of thought on the part of students, but the tearing and scattering of a telephone book does not happen by mere accident. If the persons responsible used half the effort it takes to tear a telephone book and applied it to their studies, they would probably achieve a three-point average. These junior "Charles Atlases" should find a proper outlet for their excess energy, perhaps as ditch diggers or working on demolition crews.

This willful destruction cannot be ignored, for to ignore is to condone and the Board does not condone such childish actions. If these students wish to be treated as adults, they should act as adults by proving themselves worthy of the title, not by acting like eighth-grade strong men.

These "men" were "manly" enough to rip up a telephone book (no small feat we are told), and the Board feels that they should be men enough to own up to their actions. We suggest that those students who know the identity of these individuals persuade them to make themselves known to the Student Board. When these persons have done so, the mixed lounge will be reopened.

The Board has been under attack for the closing of the lounge. We feel that the persons who treat the lounge disrespectfully are responsible for this action. It is the Student Body's duty to see that its own school is taken care of by the students, not the Student Board's responsibility. We do not enjoy playing watchdog, but when the situation becomes as acute as it has, we feel that it is our responsibility to preserve the lounge facilities from destruction so that they may be used by the students who respect them.
