LETTER TO THE CARBON:

This letter is in reference to the Carbon's editorial of October 20. There were certain discrepancies in the front page article, which we feel should be corrected.

The first of these is in regard to the condition of the Student Association budget. The editorial stated that the 61-62 budget had nearly a \$4,000 surplus, including a \$1,000 surplus from last year. The fact is that this was included in the cash on hand - the first item in the budget. The correct balance for the end of the year is \$2,777, instead of \$3,777.

Also, this \$2,777 has to cover the cost of Homecoming, yearbook convention, and money to help the Phoenix meet its expenses. These items will total nearly \$900, which leaves approximately \$1,800 to finance the remaining 8 months of the school year.

In regard to the suggestion that the Student Board purchase ping-pong tables for the mixed lounge. This matter was discussed at the last Board meeting.

In closing, the Board would like to say that they appreciate any helpful suggestions. But the Board also feels that the facts should be ascertained before they are printed as such.

NEWSPAPERMAN SPEAKS AT ASSEMBLY

William Worthy, noted Neiman Fellowship scholar, spoke at yesterday's student assembly, declaiming the deplorable inaccuracy of America's foreign correspondents. In talking to Mr. Worthy, we learned that he attributed this in large part to the set categories in which newspapermen generally classify news stories. Other factors contributing to poor reporting are the lack of knowledge of reactions and trends in the world, and the tendency to attribute all unfavorable developments to the direct agitation of the Communist Party.

Though Mr. Worthy offered no solution to the problem, he did suggest that students read deeper than merely from newspapers, and that foreign correspondents be trained in the language and customs of the people before they are stationed in a country.
