#### WAT DOES MARIAN COLLEGE NEED?

This is a survey of Marian College students' views concerning the improvements of the college. We are prone to criticize other peoples' efforts. Have you ever stopped and asked yourself: WHAT HAVE I DONE TO I PROVE MARIAN COLLEGE?

"Student's awareness of Marian activities, or better still, an awareness of the importance to attend and support school functions, would improve Marian's allower school spirit. Student apathy is one factor belying the poor attendance at school functions."

"Marian College is it's students. The reform that I would like to see, therefore, is one in the student body. The basic gripe of most students seem to stem more from their own attitude towards the school rather than from deficiencies among the majority of students: more student interest in their own student board, more participation and <u>leadership</u> in college sponsored activities and clubs. Even a men's dorm and a new library won't change Marian much if the students are uninterested and inactive."

"I think a little more perticipation in school activities would be helpful, especially from those who sit on their gluteus maximus and criticize the ones making efforts. For example, a few more boys out for sports, a few more people on the Phoenix and the yearbook staffs and a few more trying out for the various theatrical productions put on during the year." — Dick Phillips

"Better Library is what I want, and a bigger gym." -Judy Henry

"It is estimated that each year two Marian graduates enter mental institutions. It seems these cases might be eliminated if Marian offered some type of guidance program. We have counselors—qualified to deal with our academic problems—and priests to deal with our spiritual needs and problems. Should our problems be of a psychological nature and not related to academic courses or sin, we have no qualified personnel to turn to."

"There should be a psychiatrist affiliated with Marian College. A full-time psychiatrist should be a goal for Marian, but at present she should concentrate on the intermediate goal of a part-time psychiatrist. Perhaps it would be possible to incorporate the psychiatrist at St. Vincent's Hospital."—Betty Medes

"I think the school needs some changes in the curriculum, to modernize some fields and to eliminate repetition in other instances. I also feel some improvement can be made in the faculty or their teaching methods." —Beth Sutherland
