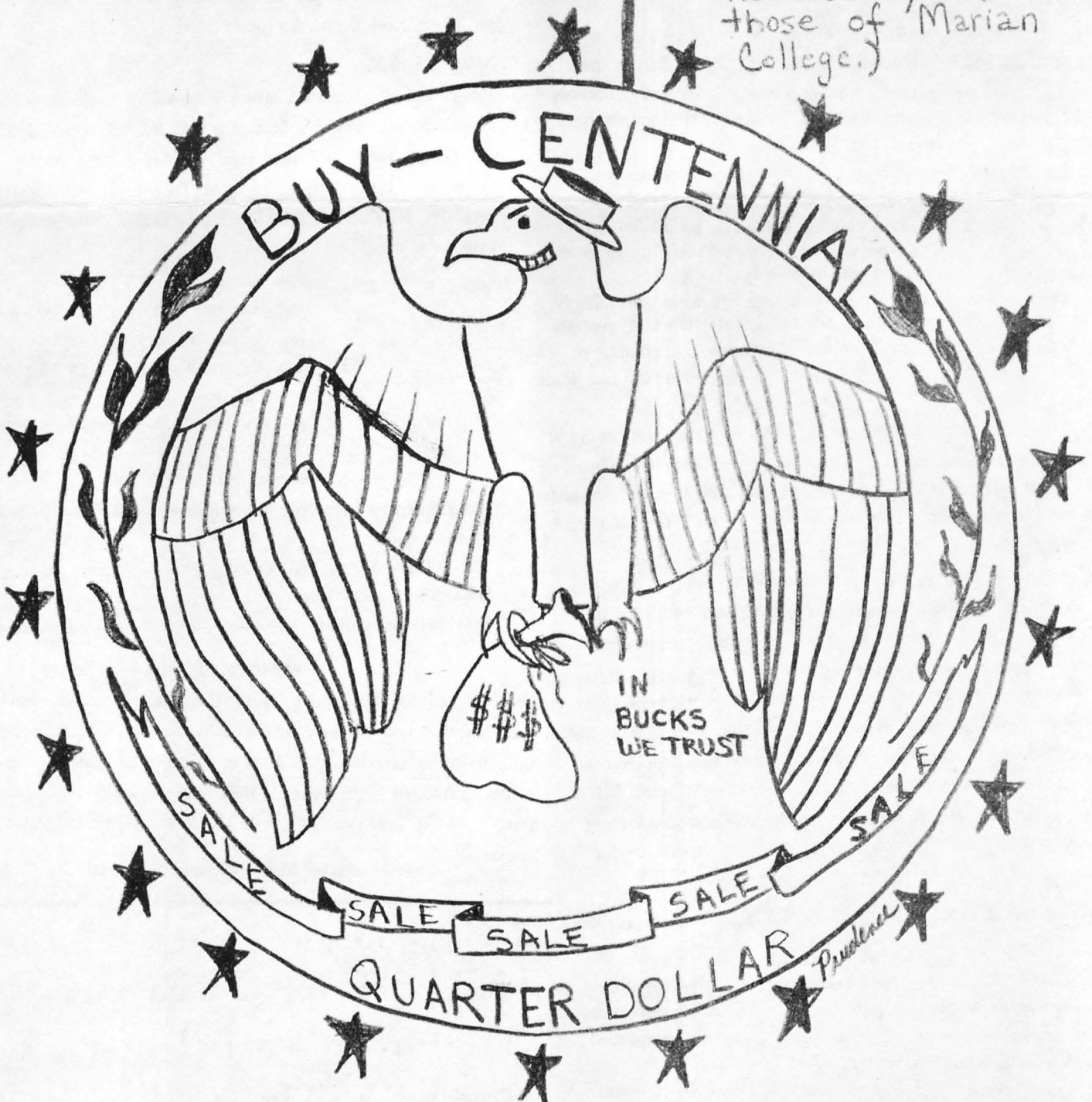

A Student Board meeting was held Sunday, Sept. 7, 1975 at 7:30.

OLD BUSINESS

Vice-President: a vote will be taken Sept. 14th on the Conduct Appeals Board, Judicial Committee and other committees. There will be a college council meeting Tuesday, at 12:00 in Room 207.

Treasurer: there is no figure yet on total enrollment. A vote will be taken on budgets next Sunday, Sept. 14th. \$5,000 was carried over from 74-75.

Committee on Social Planning: pertaining to the films-Clare Hall and Doyle Hall will put in \$400 each, Student Board will budget money and the classes won't allocate any money.

NEW BUSINESS

Vice-President: Freshman officer election will begin with self-nominations on Monday, Sept. 8th and will be open till Thurs. the 11th. Voting will take place on Wed. Sept. 17th.

Yearbook: Jackie Thiesing reported The Marian was \$600 in debt this year, and after a meeting with Paul Fox, some options were cited:

1. Drop the yearbook
2. Have the student activity fee include the price of the yearbook
3. Make the yearbook an option to pay and try to sell more ads.
4. Keep the present yearbook and continue subsidy.
5. Increase cost to \$10-\$15
