STUDENT BOARD REPORT

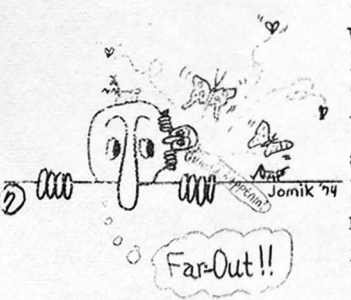
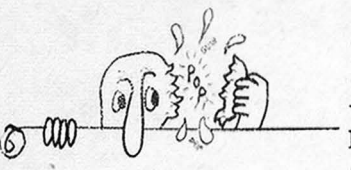
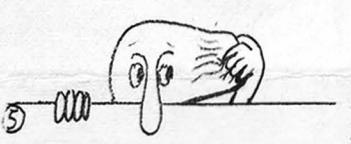
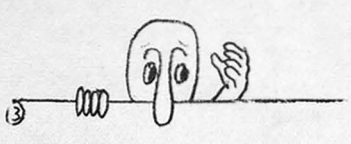
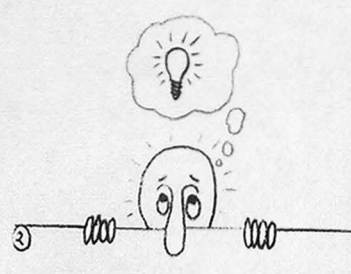
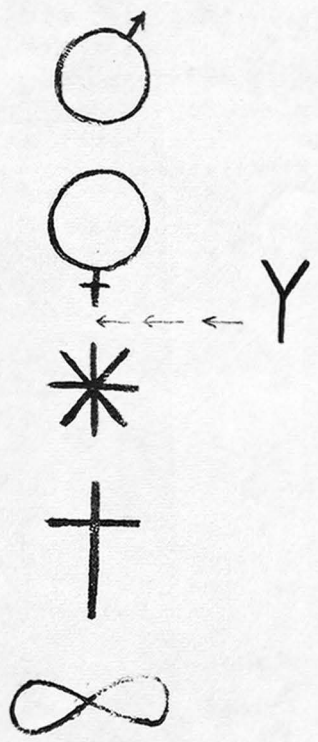

Well the 1974 Intramural football season came to an exciting end last Sunday. In front of a standing room only crowd at Reynold's Field, the Bad Joses and Stoned Rangers battles it down to the wire.

Just like in their first meeting earlier this year, the Joses won on a last second scoring effort to become this year's champions.

The game started off with the Rangers Greg Rodick kicking off to the Joses. After holding the Joses, Scott Vonderhide punted to Tom Koesters and the Rangers had the ball for the first time, only to be forced to punt. This time, the Joses Ken Aust wasted no time. Passing to Mike Bazely, Jeff Zidran and Scott Vonderhide brought the Joses to the Ranger's three yard line. Then Mike Bazely snagged a Aust pass and out raced Rodick into the end zone. The extra point try failed as Tom Koesters stepped in front of a Aust pass.

The Rangers wasted no time as they raced the clock as well as the Joses. Bill Doherty hit Greg Rodick for a quick 60 yards. Then two passes to Jer Kretchman and the big T.D. to Tom Koesters who galloped the final 12 yards. Doherty hit Kretchmann for the extra point and the half ended 7-6 Rangers.

The Rangers receded the second half kick off and were stopped at mid field and once again punted. This started a great defensive struggle. The Rangers once again contained the Joses and forced them to punt. Then the Rangers offense fizzled and again George Corns punted but Steve Barrett dropped the ball. The Joses took over and were driving when Tom Koesters intercepted an Aust pass. It looked like the Rangers had it all wrapped up when for the second time, in as many games against the Joses, a questionable call forced them to give up the ball with less than two minutes remaining.
