SPORTS

The 1960 version of Marian Knights golf team finally got back on the winning track over the Easter vacation. Led by Bill Murphy's sparkling 69, the Knights whipped a Hanover team which is ranked as one of the best in the state by the lopsided score of 15-6. Louis Firsich, Mike Corcoran, and Tom Bubb all contributed points to the cause.

In a meet at Ft. Wayne, hampered by high winds and a driving rain, Marian split a three-way meet. Indiana Tech edged Marian 8-7, but the knights trampled little Concordia 13-2. A few days later Anderson College also fell victim 10-5 with the highest Marian score for the day being 81. With this sudden surge, the linksmen are looking forward to a creditable performance in the Little State meet this Friday at Ball State. The tournament consists of a 36 hole stroke play event among the approximately sixteen teams entered.

The baseball team encountered difficulty with both opponents and the weather over Easter. They dropped a 9-7 decision to Indiana Tech, due to costly errors. After leading the Butler Bulldogs 2-1 through six innings, the opponents rose up and pulled the game out of the fire for a 7-3 verdict. The team has been sparked by the timely hitting (480) of Bill Kelsey and the pitching of Rudy Jansen. The baseball record now stands at two wins, four losses, and two ties.

The Knights were rained out of a double-header with the Huntington Foresters which they were highly favored to capture. Marian plays Indiana Central on Thursday, then tackle the Earlham nine on Saturday in a doubleheader.
