International Club News

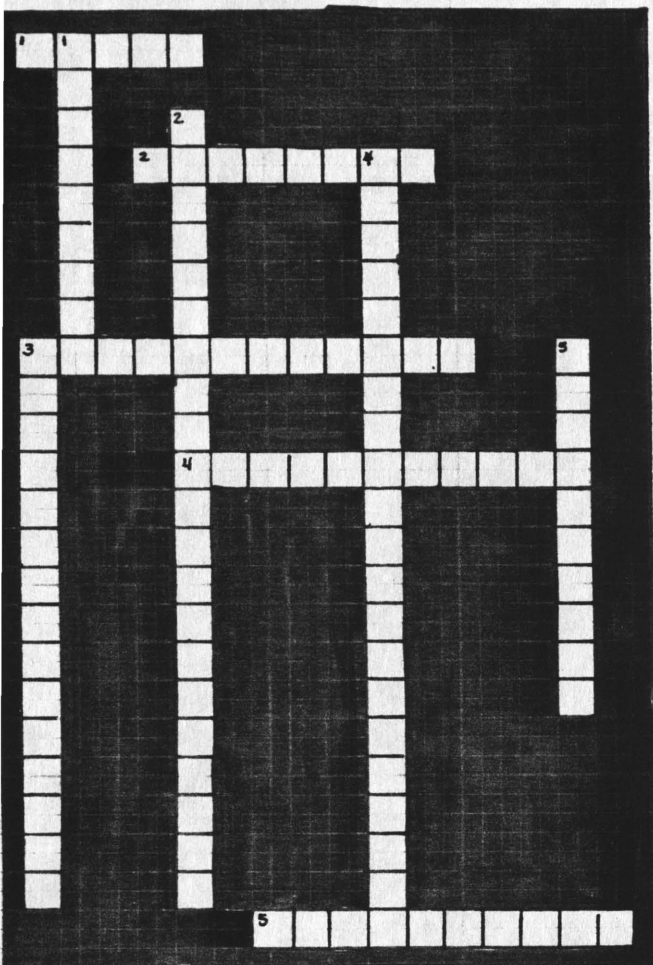
