EDITORIAL:

I believe that it is recognized that decisions are best made by a representative body of people and more injustice avoided than if it is left to one man. One man may error alone but it is unlikely that a whole group of people may make the same error. That is why American courts are based on a jury system and the power to make legislation given to Congress not the President. That is why we have a Social Council, a Student Board, a Faculty Council, a Board of Trustees, etc. I believe this principle should also be extended to Conduct Appeals. The question is, which of the two proposals for a Conduct Appeals Committee best carries this out. One has the Committee recommend that the Dean rehear a conduct case, stating its reasons. This reminds me of an authoritarian system where one man actually makes all the decision though he may allow the people to elect a representative body. But this body only plays an advisory role. As the Appeals system would be set up, the committee's decision would be subservient to the Dean's and in no way equal in weight, it would have an advisory role. The alternate proposal has the President of the College approve or reject the Committee's recommendations if they differ from the Dean's. This would at least put the committee's recommendation on an equal status with the Dean's, not subservient to it. Though not perfect, this proposal at least puts some trust in the Committee's decision.

I hope that Faculty Council will reconsider this proposal and I urge students to continue to show their support for it.

On Tuesday, February 8, Faculty Council meets to discuss the proposed Open Guest Hours. Wednesday February 9 the Board of Trustees meets to review a nd approve among other things legislation acted on by the Council. Unless Faculty Council passes the Guest Hours Tuesday the program will not go before the Trustees until May. This means implimentation will be in September.

It is easy to realize the necessity of Faculty $^{\text{C}}$ ouncil moving quickly and carefully on this peace of legislation. If passage does not occur on Tuesday, they will miss the opportunity of presenting it to the Trustees Wednesday. If they pass it without careful consideration the Trustees may reject the plan.

As a member of Student Board and close friend to the program's initiators, Camilla Consolino and Marigrace Platt, I have been able to follow the progress of the Hours plan for quite some time. I was present when the possibility of such a plan was mentioned in May, 1971. I was a gain present when Camilla and Ma rigrace drew up the planning committee and was among the first to read the plan. I supported it in Student Board discussion and attended the Student Services Committe Meeting the evening it was discussed and passed. Through this entire period I have been involved in numerous informa 1 discussions on the plan. With this much exposure to the proposed plan before the Faculty Council, I feel I am well qua lified to state the plan is reasonable, sound, workable, popular, and cannot help feel it will be of tremendous credit to Marian College's reputation. I urge the Council to support the plan and pass it.

Dean Brames has pointed out at various discussions on the plan that it is a good plan, but maintains parental permission, lacking in the present plan, is necessary. His reason has been that it is necessary for the integrity of the college. Although I disagree with the Dean on this point I feel his point is no way detrimental to the plan and if necessary an amendment to this effect would not be against major student desire.

Guest Hours is greatly desired by the students. Some have waited for a long time. Many have waited since September. I would hope Fa culty Council realizes that. This plan has been worked, reworked, discussed and rediscussed on the grass roots level and is sound and

ready for passage.


