It is difficult to say who will be the first to compromise. The Democrats know they have the upper hand with their strength in Congress. I don't think Tuesday's election was a referendum on President Ford's economic policies. But some Demoeratic leaders probably will. If President Ford makes the first move toward compromise, it could be considered as a concession to the Democratic strength. But if neithar bucges in their

The misuse of any Student Association funds is only my responsibility so I must cer－ tainly take the direct blame for the funding of the conflicting events by the Student Asso－ ciation．I can only apologize for this error and promise that in the future I will approve purchase requisitions only for those events properly budgeted for and approved by the So－ cial Committee。

If only everyone would realize how much better off we would be，by working together through the Social Committee rather than as autonomous groups，in making Marian a more ac－ tive and enjoyable place to be．
