As much as we act like it, we just can't afford separate social activities for every group that claims distinctiveness on campus.

Although U.B.I. was not budgeted for a dance last Saturday, it was approved by Student Board without going through the proper budgeting and social planning procedures.

Over the past few weeks we have read much writing of the chest-pounding variety, by graduating Board members, of their great endowments

Dear JeTuan,

In response to your letter in the Phoenix February 18, 1974, I would like to share with you the impressions I received from Black Culture Week, and also explain my whereabouts during the various activities offered.

I did not attend the play. As is my habit at all Marian theatre productions, I sit in on rehearsal during the week to get an idea of the production, to see if I want to spend two hours or so watching it on Friday or Saturday night. As with other plays, I did not care for this one. I did not go because I felt it was a poor production, not because it was done by the black students.

Monday night, Soul Night in the cafe, some black students really "opened themselves up to me". That night more than double the usual number of dirty trays were left on the tables by black students for cafe workers to clean up.

Tuesday afternoon I was at Faculty Council from 12-1:20. Consequently I missed the reception for Gwendolyn Brooks. I did attend Miss Brooks' convocation that evening and enjoyed it immensely.

Thursday evening I attended Godspell - a very rare opportunity to enjoy a professional theatre production for \$3 instead of \$6. And Friday night, after I got off work at 7, I went first to the Mug Rack to relax and then on to the skating party. No rejection intended here - I just like to have fun.

I would like you to know JeTuan, that every year during Black Culture Week, I feel more alienated, rejected and scoffed at by blacks at Marian more than any other time of the year. Personally, I feel I have treated you as I do anyone else I know - as a human being, period. I never realized before that you were black - until you kept reminding me. And one other point - my black neighbors on the third floor of Clare Hall reminded me louder than ever at 2,3,&4 am during Black Culture Week that I live with them. But then I suppose that was nothing out of the ordinary since the noise is continuous night after night.

JeTuan, I am from the same generation as you. That means I was born in the 50's, not in the 1700 and 1800's. I am white - and am not going to apologize for it. I did not have slaves, nor do I believe in slavery. Unfortunately, man can be very ugly and prejudice is one of those ugly results. I hate it. To try and combat it is very difficult indeed. Yet I firmly believe you are my equal and think of you as such. I will not treat you better than any other person for that is as wrong as treating you as an inferior. We are equal - no more - no less. As a person, I try to live according to the ideal that every man deserves to be loved - for himself be he color-blind, crippled, deaf or dumb.

I for one am damn sick and tired of being treated as if I were responsible for all the wrong-doings against blacks. I try to respect each person as himself and ask only the same in return. In a small community where black-white prejudice could be practically non-existent, I find it thriving stronger than ever. Who is to blame? We all are. Too bad we all can't overcome our immature attitudes and start acting like human beings. Why strive for black identity or white identity? Why not try HUMAN IDENTITY next year?

It is my sincere hope you will once again talk to me after you get over your anger.

STUDENT BOARD

Minutes from the Sunday, Feb. 17th Meeting

Representative Reports:

Clare Hall reported that the voting on the Dorm Constitution will be held on Feb. 27. Clare Hall rep. also reported that the basement is in the process of being renovated. Academic Affairs rep. reported that two new business courses were passed by the committee and that the Theology Department finalized its courses. Treasurer Jay Farrell reported to the Board that there is a balance free for use of \$4,076.72. President Marigrace Platt's report concerned the passing of the College divisional structure, in part; the passing of the Freshman Orientation Program by Faculty Council; and the passing of the MCSA Constitution by the Board of Trustees.

Old Business:

Mark Mauer moved that the allocation of \$50 to the Junior Class for additional Prom expenses be removed from the table. This was seconded, agreed to by consent, and passed 11-0-0. Bill Platt moved that the allocation of \$600 for an outside concert be tabled indefinitely. This was seconded and agreed to by consent. The motion clearly passed 7-3-1.

New Business:

Mark Mauer moved that the voting to accept the Constitution of the Business Club (Marian College) be tabled for 1 week in order that the Board be given additional time to review it. This was seconded and passed 10-0-0. Sarah Bergin moved that the Executive Board write a letter to Gary Coffman, Pres. of the Student Government Association of Indiana in favor of mandatory student representation on all state Boards of Trustees. The motion passed 10-0-0.
