From Student Services... Life Insurance Companies. The Student Services Office does not sponsor or endorse any private life insurance agency for the purpose of on campus solicitation of Marian College students. Any life insurance company that attempts to sell life insurance on campus without proper authorization from our office is in violation of College policy, pursuant to the 1977-78 Code of Student Rights and Responsibilities, pg. 52 of the Student Handbook. Because of problems we have had in the past with aggressive life insurance agents harassing students, and the difficulty of permitting one company to solicit but not others, our office has followed the practice of denying all requests for on campus solicitation. Obviously, insurance representatives who have Marian students as clients may legitimately meet with students on campus as long as they are here at the invitation of the student.

Although serious efforts are made to discourage life insurance agents from random solicitation of students, some agents do find their way into the residence halls. If you become the object of unwanted personal or telephone solicitation from insurance companies, please notify the Student Services Office as soon as possible. Make a note

of the particular insurance company involved and the name of the insurance agent. Tell the agent that you are filing a complaint with the Dean of Student Services and do not want to be bothered again. With the necessary information from you, our office will take further steps to follow-up with the insurance company. Room Painting Policy: I have been talking with

Since I have heard some concern over the change in this year's Variety Show, Mr. Johnson agreed to come to the next Student Board meeting on Monday night to outline the tentative plans, stage design, scripts for some of the production numbers, etc. The proposed change in the Variety Show should achieve greater audience with the two showings
