EDITOR／AL：
Last week，Doyle Hall R。A．＇s were appointed for the＇73－174 academic year．A grand tot－ al of 4 R．A．＇s were selected to＂assist students individually and collectively with acad－ emic，personal，social and adjustment concerns，and work with fellow students in establish－ ing an atmosphere conducive to growth，learning and community spirit＇．With the possibility of 8 or more floors being filled，each R．A．must be responsible for at least 2 floors （approx． 44 students per $R_{0} A_{0}$ ）．Already，the stated standard set for an R．A．cennot poss－ ibly be reached．However，it seems as though this tatedobjective is a minor concern in the selection of R．A．＇s．

Just two yars ago a total of 10 R．A．＇s were appointed at Doyle Hall，each earning $\$ 1,000$ ． This past year only 6 R．A．＇s were appointed，each earning a total of $\$ 500$ 。 In other words， R．A．＇s responsibilities have nearly doubled yet they receive half the pay．In the span of 3 years Doyle Hall is down to 4 R．A．＇s。 During the interviews of the perppective R．A．＇s each was told that $6 R_{0} A_{0}$＇s would be appointed if they felt there were 6 qualified applicants． Is this to say that out of all the R．A．applicants，only 4 were qualified to fill the pos－ ition？From Student Services point of view the answer could only be yes．

It is doubtful that R．A．＇s are appointed on the basis of leadership and responsibility， but rather on the basis of who S．S．believes will automatically report difficulties to his superiors as they occur．In reality，R．A．＇s are indirectly encouraged to foster an atmos－ phere of contempt between students and the R．A．＇s，which in turn stifles the very growth and community spirit supposidly promoted by the school。 Unless the R．A．＇s are delegated the responsibility they deserve to handle their own affairs，what is the sense of having ？．A．＇s at all？

April 13， 1973 Being directly involved with the response－ sibility of command，you can appreciate the occasional situation which makes one account－ able for the error in judgment，the immaturity or just the plain stupidity of others．As President of Marian College，I presently find myself in this unpleasant position．

To state that there is no excuse for the slur on the intellectual capabilities of the Bootstrap students which appeared in the April 6,1973 issue of the Carbon is a monumental understatement．The record verifies what every educator has known since World War II： military or former military personnel gener－ ally achieve at a higher level than do any individuals in any other representative group． At the end of the first semester of this cur－ rent academic year，the mean index for the Marian Bootstrappers was 3.00 while that for all students was 2.76 。

In the name of the vast majority of ram tional individuals who comprise the Marian College community，please accept my apology for the irresponsible actions of several stu－ dents who are not representative of the typ－ cal Marian students By not permitting facts to temper their obvious prejudice and by their vitriolic attacks，they eloquently demonstrate their pretended＂objectivity＂to be pure sham． Sincerely． Louis C．Gat to President

In commenting on this，we would like to address ourselves specifically to the stu－ dents of Marian College．

Recently，upon our initiative，we had a meeting with $D_{r}$ ．Gatto concerning the above． We were troubled primarily by two things． First of all，why weren＇t we called in if he was so displeased with us？To this he replied， ＂What good would that have done？＂As someone who claims to be an educator he should realize that it is an integral part of $t$ he educational process that if it is believed a mistake has been made，this ought to be pointed out to the person（s）who made the supposed mistake． If an error is made，how can one possibly real． ize that unless reasons as to why what was done is wrong are given？It＇s as ridiculous as a teacher not telling a child that two plus two does not equal five！

Our second concern was his tactics． What justification was there in his using the same methods for which he condemned us？We were told，in essence，＂Well，you did $i$ ． first．＂If it was wrong for us to make an in toto statement about some people，isn＇t it equally wrong for him to make an in toto states ment about us？We admitted that our blanket statement was a mistake and we apologized to those offended by it．We would not have ob－ jected had he criticized our action，but he did more than thiswohe made a blanket states （cont．next column）
