Several individuals have been summoned before a Student Board Disciplinary session for alleged mis-conduct in the Mixed Lounge. This action centered around the current problem of the "Lounge Lovers." The CARBON would like to clarify the position of the Board on this matter.

Many critics of this action have proposed many unsuitable reationalizations that have completely missed the point in question. They have skillfully maneuvered around the issue. The Board is not concerned with moral judgements on any type of behavior. The Board is not attempting to legislate "morals." The Board is not placing a moral stamp of approval or disapproval on any type of behavior under any conditions.

The issue of concern to the Student Board is the simple fact that the Mixed Lounge is not the proper place for this type of behavior regardless of any consideration of right or wrong. The fact that there is "no other place" is not a sufficient motive. No college provides "love parlors" for students who are unable to secure suitable transportation. The lounge is not intended for a substitute. This type of behavior monopolizes the facilities, creates a poor impression to visitors, and arouses many complaints from faculty and students. The Student Board can be commended for handling an increasingly serious problem within the student body without recourse to the good offices of the Student Deans.
